## Unpacking Instructions

Carefully unpack the product immediately and check the container to make sure all the parts are in the package and are in good condition.

### Claims

If the box or the contents (the product and included accessories) appear damaged from shipping, or show signs of mishandling, notify the carrier immediately, not Chauvet. Failure to report damage to the carrier immediately may invalidate a claim. Keep the box and contents for inspection.

## Safety Notes



- **ALWAYS:**
  - Connect to a grounded circuit.
  - Connect to operating voltages as specified on the product's spec sticker.
  - Disconnect from power before replacing the fuse.
  - Disconnect from its power source during periods of inactivity.
  - Use a safety cable when suspending overhead.
  - Heed all restrictions and warnings on the spec sticker.
  - Mount in a location with at least 20 in (50 cm) of ventilation.
  - Replace the fuse with the same type and rating.






### 3. Setup

#### AC Power

The Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS has an auto-ranging power supply, and it can work with an input voltage range of 100 to 240 VAC, 50/60 Hz.

To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.




- **Always connect the product to a protected circuit (a circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.**
- **To eliminate unnecessary wear and improve its lifespan, completely disconnect the product from power via breaker or by unplugging it during periods of non-use.**



**Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.**

#### Fuse Replacement

1. Disconnect the product from power.
2. Wedge the tip of a flat-head screwdriver into the slot of the fuse holder.
3. Pry the fuse holder out of the housing.
4. Remove the blown fuse from the holder and replace with a fuse of the exact same type and rating.
5. Insert the fuse holder back in place and reconnect power.



- **Disconnect the product from the power outlet before replacing the fuse.**
- **Always replace a blown fuse with one of the same type and rating.**

#### Battery Power

The Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS comes with a rechargeable lithium battery for cable-free operation.

#### Charging the Battery


The battery charges whenever the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS is plugged into a power source using the included power cable. If the product is plugged in and not in operation, make sure the product is turned off.



- **Before charging the product, read and follow the safety recommendations in the [Safety Notes](#).**
- **The LED indicator light will flash if units are overcharged.**
- **DO NOT use the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS on full power mode while being charged/plugged into a power source, as the unit will get extremely hot.**

#### Battery Life Indicator

The numbers displayed on the battery indicator show how much battery life remains available. The battery indicator will display up to four (+) signs while charging.

### Mounting


### Orientation

The Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS may be mounted in any position; however, make sure adequate ventilation is provided around the product.

### Rigging

- Before deciding on a location for the product, always make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming purposes.
- Make sure adequate ventilation is provided around the product.
- Mount the product on a structure or surface that can support the product's weight (see the [Technical Specifications](#) for weight information).
- Always use a safety cable when mounting the product overhead. Mount the product securely to a rigging point (e.g., an elevated platform or a truss).
- Use a mounting clamp of appropriate weight capacity when rigging the product onto a truss.

Button	Function

## DMX Configuration

### DMX Personality and Starting Address

When selecting a starting DMX address, always consider the number of DMX channels the selected DMX mode uses. Choosing a starting address that is too high could restrict access to some of the product's channels.


The Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS uses up to 14 DMX channels in a 14CH DMX mode, which defines the highest configurable address to **499**.


To select the starting address, do the following:

2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the starting address, from **001–499**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Standalone Configuration

Set the product in one of the standalone modes to control without a DMX controller.



**Never connect a product that is operating in any standalone mode to a DMX string connected to a DMX controller. Products in standalone mode may transmit DMX signals that could interfere with the DMX signals from the controller.**

### Run Mode

#### Automatic mode

To run the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS in automatic mode, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Run Mode** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Auto**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

#### Sound-active mode

To run the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS in sound mode, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Run Mode** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Sound**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

#### RF mode

To use the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS with an RFC or RFC-XL remote, it must first be set to RF mode. To do this, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Run Mode** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RF**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Manual Mode

To operate the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS manually through the menu, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Run Mode** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Manual**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **Pan, Tilt, Color, Gobo, Gobo Rotate, Prism, Focus, Dimmer, or Shutter**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.
7. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to increase or decrease the value of the selected function, from **000–255**.
8. Press **<ENTER>**.
9. Repeat steps 6–9 until the product is set as desired.

## Settings Configuration

Use a DMX controller to set and control the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS.

### D-Fi Settings

To access the D-Fi Setting menu on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DFI** (to activate D-Fi mode) or **DFI Channel** (to set the D-Fi channel).
4. Press **<ENTER>**.

To set which D-Fi mode the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS will follow, follow the instructions below:

1. Select the **DFI** option.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RX** (to set the product to receive D-Fi signal), **TX** (to set the product to transmit D-Fi signal), or **OFF** (to deactivate D-Fi mode).
3. Press **<ENTER>**.

To set the D-Fi channel on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, do the following:

1. Select the **DFI Channel** option.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to set the D-Fi channel, from **1–16**.
3. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Pan Reverse

To manually set the orientation of the pan on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, follow the instructions below:

4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **OFF** (normal pan motion) or **ON** (reversed pan motion).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Tilt Reverse

To manually set the orientation of the tilt on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Tilt Reverse**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **OFF** (normal tilt motion) or **ON** (reversed tilt motion).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Screen Reverse

To manually set the orientation of the tilt on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Screen Reverse**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **OFF** (normal screen display) or **ON** (reversed screen display).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Pan Range

To set the maximum angle of the pan on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Pan Range**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to set the pan angle from **180** (180°), **360** (360°), or up to **540** (540°).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Tilt Range

To set the maximum angle of the tilt on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Tilt Range**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to set the tilt angle from **90** (90°), **180** (180°), or up to **234** (234°).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

## Operation

### Totem Mode

To restrict the range of pan and tilt motion based on how the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS is mounted, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Totem Mode**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **OFF** (no restriction on the pan and tilt motion), **UP** (restricts the pan and tilt motion for overhead mounting), or **DOWN** (restricts the pan and tilt motion for surface or floor mounting).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Sound Sensitivity

To set the sound sensitivity on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Sensitivity**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to increase or decrease the sound sensitivity, from **000–100**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### DMX Loss

To set the action that the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS will do when the DMX signal is lost, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DMX Loss**.

Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **Hold** (holds the last setting when DMX signal is lost), **Black** (blacks out the fixture when DMX signal is lost), **Auto** (sets the fixture to Auto mode when DMX signal is lost), or **Sound** (sets the fixture to Sound mode when DMX signal is lost).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Indicator

To enable or disable the LED indicator on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Indicator**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **ON** (enables the LED indicator) or **OFF** (disables the LED indicator).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Flash if DMX

To set whether the LED indicator flashes when the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS is connected to or disconnected from the DMX, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Flash if DMX**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **ON** (the LED indicator flashes when the fixture is connected to the DMX) or **OFF** (the LED indicator flashes when the fixture is disconnected to the DMX).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

### Run Time

To adjust the run time on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Runtime**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the number of hours the fixture will run: **4 Hours**, **6 Hours**, or **8 Hours**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.



**The maximum output is inversely proportional to the run time: The brighter the output, the less run time available.**

## RF Setting

To set how the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS will receive RF signal and work with RF remotes, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RF**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from the following: **Common** (to allow the fixture to respond to all RF signals), **Bind** (to link the fixture to a single RF remote), or **Off** (to turn off RF reception).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

## RF Group

To select which group of fixtures the RF remote will control, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RF Group**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Group 1–4**.
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

## Follow Spot

To enable control of the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS via ILS command, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Follow Spot**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **ON** (enables Follow Spot mode) or **OFF** (disables Follow Spot mode).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

## Product Reset

To reset individual or all functions on the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS upon startup, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Reset**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **YES** (enables reset of all functions from startup) or **NO** (disables product reset from startup).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

## Factory Reset

To reset the product to factory default settings, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** is displayed.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Factory Reset**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **YES** (enables factory reset) or **NO** (disables factory reset).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

To view the product information, do the following:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Sys Info** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to choose among:
  - **Ver:** displays the current software version of the fixture
  - **Running Mode:** displays the current running mode
  - **DMX Address:** displays the DMX address
  - **Temperature:** displays the LED PCB temperature in °C
  - **DFI:** displays the fixture's D-Fi status

## Calibration Menu

To access the calibration menu of the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS, do the following:

1. Power on the product.
2. Once the screen displays the CHAUVET DJ logo, press the **<ENTER>** and **<DOWN>** buttons simultaneously.
  - The screen will display **"MOTOR SET"** above and **"Resetting..."** below the CHAUVET DJ logo.
3. After about 10 seconds, the screen will show the calibration menu.

## ILS Mode

ILS (Integrated Lighting System) provides 4 modes that synchronize with the GigBAR MOVE+ILS: Modes 1 and 3 synchronize with side 1 of the GigBAR MOVE+ILS, whereas modes 2 and 4 synchronize with side 2 of the GigBAR MOVE+ILS. When linked, effects will sync with the most similar effect on the selected side of the GigBAR MOVE+ILS: Kinta effects will sync with one of the kintas, moving heads will sync with one of the moving heads, and wash effects will sync with one of the pars. Laser effects will sync with the laser, and strobe effects will sync with the strobe effects regardless of ILS mode.

This product will synchronize with the spot effect on the selected side of the GigBAR MOVE+ILS, as well as the laser and strobes.

To set the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS to respond to an ILS signal:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **ILS** shows on the display.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from **ILS1** (side 1), **ILS2** (side 2), **ILS3** (side 1), or **ILS4** (side 2).
3. Press **<ENTER>**.

## Master/Slave Mode

The Master/Slave mode allows a single Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS product (the "master") to control the actions of one or more Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS products (the "slaves") without the need of a DMX controller. The master product will be set to operate in Standalone, whereas the slave products will be set to operate in Slave mode. Once set and connected, the slave products will operate in unison with the master product. Configure the products as indicated below.

### Slave products:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display. Press **<ENTER>**.
2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **DFI**. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RX**. Press **<ENTER>**.
4. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Run Mode** shows on the display. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **Slave**. Press **<ENTER>**.
6. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the slave unit(s), from **Slave1–4**. Press **<ENTER>**.
7. Set the DMX address to **001**.
8. Set the D-Fi to receive a specific channel, **1–16**.
9. Finish setting and connecting all the slave products.

### Master product:

1. Set the master product to operate in standalone mode.
2. Set the D-Fi to transmit on the D-Fi channel the slaves are receiving on.
  - **For more information on how to activate the Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS built-in D-Fi, see [D-Fi Settings](#).**
  - **All products must be set to the same DMX personality, DMX address, and D-Fi channel.**
  - **Configure all the slave products before configuring the master to transmit.**
  - **Never connect a DMX controller to a D-Fi channel configured for Master/Slave operation because the controller may interfere with the signals from the master.**



## RFC Remote Control


The Intimidator Free Spot 60 ILS can be operated with an RFC remote or an RFC-XL remote (sold separately). To enable RF control, follow the instructions below:

1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **Setup** shows on the display.
2. Press **<ENTER>**.
3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select **RF**.
4. Press **<ENTER>**.
5. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select from the following: **Common** (to allow the fixture to respond to all RF signals), **Bind** (to link the fixture to a single RF remote), or **Off** (to turn off RF reception).
6. Press **<ENTER>**.

## RFC-XL Remote Control Operation



### Automatic Mode

Automatic mode will enable you to run the automatic programs on the product.

To turn on Automatic mode:

1. Press **<AUTO>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to choose between the different auto programs.

To adjust the speed of the automatic program:

1. Press **<SPEED/SENSITIVITY>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to increase or decrease the speed of the program.

### Sound-Active Mode

To turn on Sound-Active mode:

1. Press **<SOUND>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to select a sound-active program.

To adjust the sound sensitivity:

1. Press **<SPEED/SENSITIVITY>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to increase or decrease the sensitivity.

### Dimmer

To adjust the total output of the product:

1. Press **<DIMMER>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to increase or decrease the output level.

### Prism

To adjust the focus of the product's output:

1. Press **<PRISM>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to select the prism.

### Focus

To adjust the focus of the product's output:

1. Press **<FOCUS>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to adjust the focus.

### Pan

To adjust the product's pan angle:

1. Press **<PAN>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to adjust the pan.

### Tilt

To adjust the product's tilt angle:

1. Press **<TILT>**.
2. Press **<+>** or **<->** to adjust the tilt.

### Black Out

To black out the lights of the product:

1. Press **<Black OUT>**. This will turn off all the lights until the button is pressed again.



The RFC-XL remote will not respond to any inputs when Black Out is activated. If the remote does not respond when a button is pressed, try pressing **<BLACK OUT>**. You may have inadvertently activated Black Out.

## 5. Maintenance

### Product Maintenance

Dust build-up reduces light output performance and can cause overheating. This can lead to reduction of the light source's life and/or mechanical wear. To maintain optimum performance and minimize wear, clean all lighting products at least twice a month. However, be aware that usage and environmental conditions could be contributing factors to increase the cleaning frequency.

To clean the product, follow the instructions below:

1. Unplug the product from power.
2. Wait until the product is at room temperature.
3. Use a vacuum (or dry compressed air) and a soft brush to remove dust collected on the external surface/vents.
4. Clean all transparent surfaces with a mild soap solution, ammonia-free glass cleaner, or isopropyl alcohol.
5. Apply the solution directly to a soft, lint-free cotton cloth or a lens-cleaning tissue.
6. Softly drag any dirt or grime to the outside of the transparent surface.
7. Gently polish the transparent surfaces until they are free of haze and lint.



**Always dry the transparent surfaces carefully after cleaning them.**
