- CAUTION: When transferring product from extreme temperature environments, (e.g., cold truck to warm, humid ballroom) condensation may form on the internal electronics of the product. To avoid causing a failure, allow product to fully acclimate to the surrounding environment before connecting it to power.
- Not for permanent outdoor installation in locations with extreme environmental conditions. This
 includes, but is not limited to:
 - Exposure to a marine/saline environment (within 3 miles of a saltwater body of water).

Expected LED Lifespan

Over time, use and heat will gradually reduce LED brightness. Clustered LEDs produce more heat than single LEDs, contributing to shorter lifespans if always used at full intensity. The average LED lifespan is 40,000 to 50,000 hours. To extend LED lifespan, maintain proper ventilation around the product, and limit the overall intensity.


Description

The COLORado Batten Q15 is a quad-color RGBW LED batten with 15 individually controllable LEDs that eliminate the appearance of "skittles" and allow for awesome pixel-mappable looks. The IP65-rated product features tremendous output with selectable, smooth dimming curves, convenient color temperature presets and an extraordinary reach with a native 16° beam angle. An included wall wash filter creates a 16° by 43° beam spread for guaranteed smoothness. Mount it your way by adjustable trunnions with ½ turn adapters for the Omega Bracket, innovative end-cap, or back plate mounting for seamless row alignment, icicles, and floor mounting. The unit also includes a stow-able glare shield.



3. Setup

AC Power

The COLORado Batten Q15 has an auto-ranging power supply and it can work with an input voltage range of 100 to 240 VAC, 50/60 Hz.

To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.



- Always connect the product to a protected circuit (a circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure
 the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or
 fire.
- To eliminate unnecessary wear and improve its lifespan, during periods of non-use completely disconnect the product from power via breaker or by unplugging it.



Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.

AC Plug

The COLORado Batten Q15 comes with a power input cord terminated with a Seetronic Powerkon A connector on one end and an Edison plug on the other end (U.S. market). If the power input cord that came with your product has no plug, or if you need to change the plug, use the table below to wire the new plug.

Power Linking

The product supports power linking. You can power link up to 6 products at 100 V; up to 8 products at 120 V; up to 14 products at 208 V; up to 15 products at 230 V; or up to 16 products at 240 V. This product comes with a power input cord. Power linking cables are available from Chauvet for purchase.


Remote Device Management (RDM)

Remote Device Management, or RDM, is a standard for allowing DMX-enabled devices to communicate bi-directionally along existing DMX cabling. Check the DMX controller's User Manual or with the manufacturer as not all DMX controllers have this capability. The COLORado Batten Q15 supports RDM protocol that allows feedback to make changes to menu map options.

Filter Installation

The COLORado Batten Q15 includes a filter and a glare shield. Follow the procedure below to install or remove the filter or glare shield.

- 1. Locate the end of the product on the side which has the power and DMX input ports.
- 2. Squeeze the filter locking tabs in. The latch bar will pop up.
- 3. Slide the filter and/or glare shield in or out.
- 4. Press down on the latch bar until it clicks into place.





Mounting

Before mounting the product, read and follow the safety recommendations indicated in the <u>Safety Notes</u>. For our CHAUVET Professional line of mounting clamps, go to http://trusst.com/products/.

Orientation

Always mount this product in a safe position, making sure there is adequate room for ventilation, configuration, and maintenance.

Rigging


Chauvet recommends using the following general guidelines when mounting this product.

- Before deciding on a location for the product, make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming purposes.
- Make sure that the structure onto which you are mounting the product can support the product's weight. See the <u>Technical Specifications</u> for weight information.
- When mounting the product overhead, always use a safety cable. Mount the product securely to a rigging point, whether an elevated platform or a truss.
- When rigging the product onto a truss, use a mounting clamp of appropriate weight capacity.

Procedure

The COLORado Batten Q15 comes with a bracket to which you can attach a mounting clamp directly. Mounting clamps are sold separately. Make sure the clamps are capable of supporting the weight of this product. Use at least two mounting points per product. For the CHAUVET Professional line of mounting clamps, go to http://www.trusst.com/products.

Base Plate

Each COLORado Batten Q15 comes with a base plate and 2 retaining pins, which can be used for floor mounting or vertical hanging.




The retaining pins each have a safety cable for added security.

Attaching the Base Plate

To attach the base plate to either end of the COLORado Batten Q15:


- 1. Align the base plate so the loops on the end of the product and the loops on the base plate line up and fit into each other.
- 2. Tighten the captive screws on the base plate.
- 3. Press and hold the latch button down on the first retaining pin, and insert it through one of the sets of loops on the product and base plate. Release the latch button, then repeat with the other pin.





Mounting Diagram (with Base Plate)

Before mounting this product, read the <u>Safety Notes</u>. Make sure the mounting clamp is capable of supporting the weight of the product. For our Chauvet line of mounting clamps, go to http://trusst.com/productcategory/truss-clamps/.





To properly floor-mount this product, the base plate must be bolted to a stable surface, such as the stage floor, or a large base plate.



Series Attachment Instructions


2 COLORado Batten Q15 products can be attached together with the included retaining pins to mount them both from one mounting point. Do not connect any more than 2 COLORado Batten Q15 products in a row when hanging vertically.



The retaining pins each have a safety cable for added security.

To attach 2 products in series:

- 1. Align them end to end so the loops on either end of the product line up with each other.
- 2. Press and hold the latch button down on the first retaining pin, and insert it through one of the sets of loops on both products. Release the latch button, then repeat with the other pin.






Install the safety cables last when attaching COLORado Batten Q15 products in series.



Mounting Products Attached in Series

- Attach the base plate to the first product in the series. (See <u>Attaching the Base Plate</u>)
 Attach an omega bracket to the base plate, and a clamp to the omega bracket.
 Attach the clamp to the desired structure or surface.

- 4. Attach a safety cable to the product's safety loop.





Never attach more than 2 products together when hanging vertically from a single mounting point.

Control Options

Set the COLORado Batten Q15 starting address in the 001–509 DMX range. This enables control of up to 6 products in the 76-channel **15 HSIC** personality, or up to 128 products in the 4-channel **1 Simple** personality.

Programming

Refer to the Menu Map to understand the menu options. The menu map shows the main level and a variable number of programming levels for each option.

- To go to the desired main level, press **<MENU>** repeatedly until the option shows on the display. Press **<ENTER>** to select. This will take you to the first programming level for that option.
- To select an option or value within the current programming level, press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** until the option shows on the display. Press **<ENTER>** to select. In this case, if there is another programming level, you will see that first option, or you will see the selected value.
- Press <MENU> repeatedly to exit to the previous main level.

- 4. Increase or decrease the dimmer value from **0–100%**.

Preset Color Temperatures

- 1. Go to the Static Colors main level.
- 2. Select the CCT Temper option.
- 3. Select from White 1-14.
- 4. Increase or decrease the dimmer value from **0–100%**.

Custom Color Mixing

- 1. Go to the Static Colors main level.
- 2. Select the **RGBW** option.
- 3. Select which color value to edit, from Red, Green, Blue, or White.
- 4. Increase or decrease the value of the selected color from **0–255**.

Automatic Programs

The COLORado Batten Q15 has preset automatic programs and customizable programs.

Run Program

- 1. Go to the **Auto Programs** main level.
- 2. Select the **Run** option.
- 3. Select from AUTO.1–10 (preset programs) or Program 1–10 (customizable programs).
- 4. Increase or decrease the SPEED from 0-100%.

Customize Program

- 1. Go to the Auto Programs main level.
- 2. Select the **Edit** option.
- 3. Select from Program 1–10.
- 4. Select from Scene 01–30.
- 5. Select which color value to edit, from Red, Green, Blue, or White.
- 6. Increase or decrease the value of the selected color from **0–255**.

Configuration (Settings)

Output Setting

To select how the product keeps from going over the maximum temperature:

- 1. Go to the Output Setting main level.
- 2. Select from **Power Mode** (adjusts output as temperature increases) or **Steady Mode** (maintains a lower output to keep temperature steady).

Master/Slave

The Master/Slave mode allows a group of COLORado Batten Q15 products (the slaves) to simultaneously duplicate the output of another COLORado Batten Q15 (the master) without a DMX controller. To set each of the slaves:

- 1. Go to the Master/Slave main level.
- 2. Select Slave.

To set the master:

- 1. Go to the Master/Slave main level.
- Select Master.
- 3. Select a standalone setting.
 - The master is the one that runs a program whether in Auto or Static mode.



- Do not connect a DMX controller to the products configured for Master/Slave operation. The DMX controller may interfere with signals from the master.
- The master should be the first product in the daisy chain.



Dimmer Mode

This setting determines how fast the output of the COLORado Batten Q15 changes when you modify the output value. This setting provides four different options to simulate the dimming curve of an incandescent lighting product.

- 1. Go to the **Dimmer Mode** main level.
- 2. Select a dimmer curve (OFF, DIM1, DIM2, DIM3, or DIM4).



OFF: The output is proportional (linear) to the dimmer channel value. **DIM1-4**: The output follows the dimmer value based on the corresponding dimmer curve, DIM1 being the fastest.

Pulse Width Modulation

To set the PWM frequency:

- 1. Go to the **LED Frequency** main level.
- 2. Select the frequency, from 1200Hz, 2000Hz, 2400Hz, 4000Hz, 6000Hz, or 25000Hz.

Cell Order

To set the cell order:

- 1. Go to the Cell Order main level.
- Select the direction from 1 15(Left to Right) or 15 1(Right to Left).

DMX Error/Loss

To select what happens when a DMX signal is lost:

- 1. Go to the **Settings** main level.
- 2. Enter the passcode (<UP>, <DOWN>, <UP>, <DOWN>, <ENTER>).
- 3. Select the **DMX Error/Loss** option.
- 4. Select from Hold Last (continues last command) or Blackout (blacks out).

Display Timeout

To set the duration of inactivity before the display turns off:

Product Maintenance

Dust build-up reduces light output performance and can cause overheating. This can lead to reduction of the light source's life and/or mechanical wear. To maintain optimum performance and minimize wear, clean your lighting products at least twice a month. However, be aware that usage and environmental conditions could be contributing factors to increase the cleaning frequency.

To clean the product, follow the instructions below:

- 1. Unplug the product from power.
- 2. Wait until the product is at room temperature.
- 3. Use a vacuum (or dry compressed air) and a soft brush to remove dust collected on the external surface/vents.
- 4. Clean all transparent surfaces with a mild soap solution, ammonia-free glass cleaner, or isopropyl alcohol.
- 5. Apply the solution directly to a soft, lint free cotton cloth or a lens cleaning tissue.
- 6. Softly drag any dirt or grime to the outside of the transparent surface.7. Gently polish the transparent surfaces until they are free of haze and lint.



Always dry the transparent surfaces carefully after cleaning them.


